Care and recovery of natural areas

The program consisted of reforesting and recovering mixed ecosystems of xerophilous scrub and grassland in the northeast of San Luis Potosí and Zacatecas, operating community brigades for the sustainable use of biodiversity, preserving endemic fauna in danger of extinction and cleaning bodies of water to alleviate the serious problem of contamination with plastic materials and recycling them.



Conservation of sea turtles

Promotes environmental education and the conservation of species. Therefore, through the Comprehensive Program for the Conservation of Sea Turtles, 4 species of sea turtles that nest on the beaches of 4 properties of The Palace Company in Cancun, Quintana Roo, are protected and safeguarded.



Labor inclusion program for people with disabilities

Promote strategies for the development of academic, professional and labor skills and competencies that contribute to the exercise of Human Rights, the social, cultural and economic participation of people with motor disabilities, in situations of vulnerability, exclusion and discrimination.



Labor reintegration of women deprived of liberty

Achieve the effective social reintegration of women deprived of their liberty and graduates of a penitentiary center in the State of Mexico and Mexico City.

Improve the health and sustainability of the trees in Chapultepec Forest by implementing comprehensive assessment, treatment, management and conservation measures; in order to guarantee public safety, preserve biodiversity, mitigate the impacts of climate change and promote the social and cultural well-being of the community.



Regeneration of chinampa soil and reactivation of traditional agriculture

Conservation of the agroecological production system of the chinampas of Xochimilco through the regeneration and enrichment of the soil of abandoned chinampas, the reactivation of organic agriculture in chinampas and the increase in the number of plants for pollinators.
